

## Financial Assistance Options for Pet Owners

**Care Credit** - <https://www.carecredit.com/> A credit card that allows clients to pay veterinary expenses in payment plans with no interest for a limited time.

**Scratchpay** - <https://scratchpay.com/> A veterinary financing site that allows qualified pet owners to make payments over time.

**Cooper's Legacy Foundation** - <https://www.cooperslegacyfoundation.org/> An organization that helps families with sick or injured pets who need assistance with medical treatment.

**Furry Faces Foundation** - <http://www.furryfaces.org/home.html> An all-volunteer based organization that has assistance options to keep pets with their families and helps reduce the number of animals needing to be surrendered to shelters and rescue groups.

**Imom** - <http://www.imom.org/> An organization that provides numerous assistance options and only provides veterinary aid in cases of life-threatening emergencies – which must be confirmed in writing by a veterinarian. They require the applicant to try Care Credit first. They also have a separate section that allows people to put their case to the public and ask for aid.

**RedRover** - <https://redrover.org/> An organization that provides a crisis relief program for pet owners who's needs are directly related to a disaster emergency.

**Face Foundation** - <https://face4pets.org/> An organization that provides financial assistance to animal owners who are unable to cover the full cost of their pets' critical or emergency veterinary care.

**The Pet Fund** - <https://www.thepetfund.com/> An organization that will not fund emergencies (due to time constraints) but may be able to offer other veterinary cost assistance. However, they have strict sign up policies and guidelines, please see their website for specifics.

**AAHA** - <https://www.aaha.org/> An organization that offers financial assistance for veterinary care however, the veterinarian must apply for a grant to treat the animal. The pet owner cannot apply themselves.

**The Magic Bullet Fund** - <https://themagicbulletfund.org/> An organization that helps provide financial assistance for low-income pet owners whose dog or cat are diagnosed with cancer.
